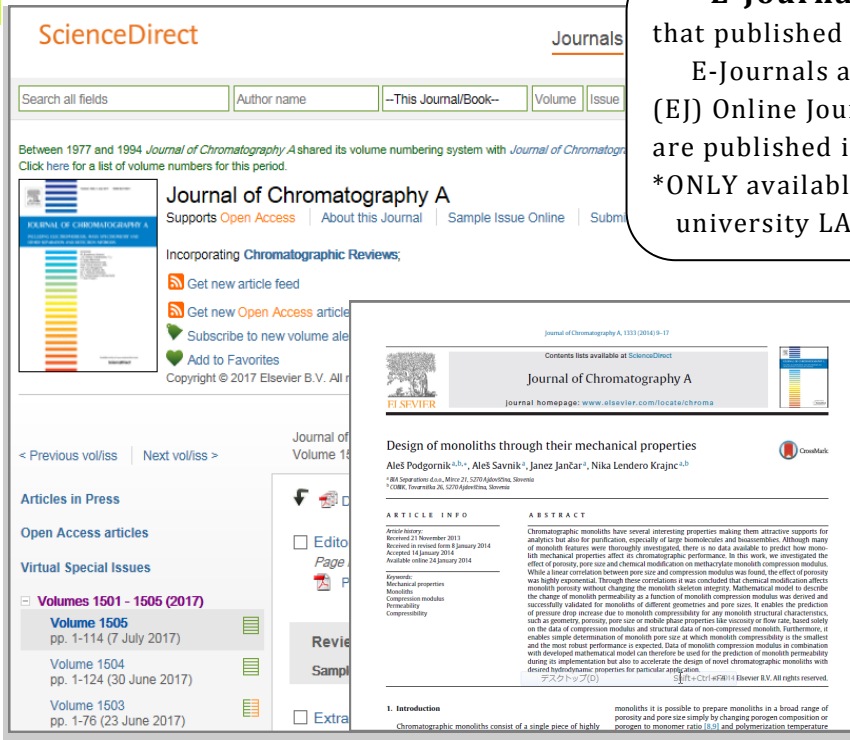


Let's try E-Journals!

Search from TUT Link (SFX)

What is E-journals?



E-Journals are intellectual magazines that published in electronic format on the Web. E-Journals also known as Electronic Journal (EJ) Online Journal (OJ). Most of the E-Journals are published in **PDF** or **HTML** format. ***ONLY** available for computer that connected to university LAN.

***Use VPN connection** or "GakuNin" service if you are at outside of the campus. You can access the link as below when you are outside of the campus. http://www.lib.tut.ac.jp/ejournal/out_campus.html. Access this link <http://www.imc.tut.ac.jp/> (Information and Media Center Webpage) to get the information about the setting for VPN connection. Click "Use Internet" then choose "VPN connection", you can get the instruction there.

More than **5,000** pieces of E-Journals are available from **ScienceDirect, Wiley Online Library, SpringerLINK, ACM Digital Library, Nature, Science** and etc.

There are only **49** printed international magazines provided by university in 2017.

Advantages of E-Journals

- ★read journal at anytime or anywhere!
- ★Several people can read the journal in the same time.
- ★Don't have to wait for printed magazines, you can read the latest journal.
- ★can get more information through the links in the journal.

【Important】 It is easy to use our E-Journals, but these are the rules:

==Rules and regulations on using E-journals==

- * Must not engage in systematic downloading (PDF or HTML file) manually or software.
- * Download more than half volume of a journal in the same time is prohibited
- * Provide print or electronic copies of journal to anyone is forbidden.
- * Must not use for any commercial purpose. Only for private study or research!
- * Act that infringes on copyright and intellectual property rights is forbidden

If you break the rules, your use of all E-journals will be suspended !

Access E-Journals by searching ① TUT Link (SFX)

Ex: If you want to look for Journal of Chromatography A vol.1505 p. 1-17(2017)

Go to library webpage, then click "E-Journals". It will link you to <http://sfx10.usaco.co.jp/tut/az?lang=eng> You can search journal title by using **TUT Link (SFX)**.

TUT Link (SFX)

1 Type Journal title in the search field
Ex: Type "Journal of Chromatography A" and click search

✖ You can't search by article title here. If you want to search by using the journal title, volume, page or DOI, please click CitationLinker and type volume, issue and page.

2 If journal is available, you can find it in the list. The year that shown in the list is year that article is available.
Ex: Journals from year 1998,793volume 1issue are available. Click the title of the journal.

3 Window as No.3 will be shown. Click "Go" and will link you to the journal website.

4 Choose the Volume or Issue that you want from the website. OR

5 Use "Advance Search" to search journal

6 Journal that is available for full text:

1.ScienceDirect
Green or Orange mark Open Access will be shown at the end of the title

2.SpringerLINK
"Download PDF" or "View Article" will be shown. If you can't open the file, please click "Look Inside" and you can read the article from page 2.

3.Wiley Online Library
You can see this mark if the text is available. Click the PDF or HTML file, then you can get the full text.

1 Type Journal title in the search field

4 Choose the Volume or Issue that you want from the website

5 Use "Advance Search" to search journal
